The aim of this PDW is to bring together scholars from different domains of management science who share an interest in the growing importance of visuality in the various fields of organization and management studies. Visual communication and artifacts have become a rapidly increasing concern in a broad array of research areas, addressing a plethora of substantive organizational topics, but also opening up more practical opportunities to enhance research designs and data collection methods. The focus of the session is, therefore, both conceptual/theoretical and practical: On the one hand, we raise questions about how to fruitfully theorize about visuality, and speculate about a potential future research agenda; on the other, we address more hands-on issues like methodological concerns and challenges linked to collecting and analyzing visual data, as well as reporting and publishing visual research.

Workshop outline

The PDW will be held in an interactive format, encompassing 2 hours in total. First, the co-organizers will introduce the topic with a broad overview of the current visual research agenda in organization and management research and its manifold facets, promising avenues, and major challenges.

The panelists and roundtable facilitators – seven distinguished scholars in various areas of visual research – will then provide brief insights into selected approaches, methods/methodologies, and areas of application:

Participants will choose a roundtable dedicated to a particular conceptual and/or methodological focus that will be facilitated by the PDW co-organizers and senior faculty. The aim for each round-table is the exchange of particular research ideas and discussion of issues and challenges. Each facilitator will, eventually, present the main conclusions of the round-table to the plenum, and the PDW will conclude with a Q&A and wrap-up session.

No separate registration for the PDW is necessary.
